: the construction of new fencing, signage and 40kph speed restriction on Brisbane Water Drive in the vicinity of Point Clare School;

: safety fencing and new road surfacing along Brisbane Water Drive at Tascott

: election promise by the Premier for \$23mil expenditure on BWD & Blackwall Rd WW. This included provision for traffic lights at Koolinda Ave /BWD, & safety improvements and turning bays at Penang, Lorraine, Sunshine & Sunnyside Drive /BWD intersections in Point Clare;

: resurfacing of Glenrock Parade at Koolewong;

: Local Government Forum 'Mingle with the Candidates' held 17/08/17 for the West Gosford Ward - Central Coast Council;

: Coache Park replacement stairway and BWD foreshore reserve pontoon and jetty refurbishment at Koolewong;

- Follow the progress of the upgrade of Brisbane Water Drive from West Gosford to Koolewong by NSW RMS with attention to the Premiers 2017 State Election promise of \$8million for Traffic Lights at the intersection of Koolinda and Jirrah Brisbane Water Drive Point Clare

- Installation of Dingy Racks in foreshore parks to tidy up the ground areas for safe children's playing areas



Dear Members, We have decided that the name for our Newsletter should reflect our World Global position, hence the name Longitude 151°. With the amalgamation of Gosford and Wyong Councils to form the Central Coast Council being now the 3rd largest Shire in NSW it is disturbing to see that some Councillors seem to be focused on propagating a move for de-amalgamation of the Central Coast Council, requesting costing from Council Staffers re the cost to the Ratepayers of the cost of Amalgamation and henceforth the perceived cost of de-amalgamation. This move coming on the back of the recent push for a decision on the site of our long delayed preferred site for our partly funded Central Coast Performing Arts Centre with in part funding by the NSW State Government and the Central Coast Council seems to effect a need to verbalise with the Central Coast Regional Development Corporation being an arm of the NSW State Government to define an outcome for the betterment of our community.

I produced the series in 1989 and it broke all ratings records when it was shown on ITV U.K with 15 million viewers on the first night and 15.3 million on the last night. It was available on VHS for a while then disappeared. We have restored the series and it will be available early in the new year for the first time on DVD. 

Council as at the 15th August 2018. Council has amended its Development Application Policy so any application receiving 15 or more objections will now be automatically reported to Council for determination. This replaces the previous threshold of 50 objections for a development application to be automatically reported to Council. \$23 MILLION DELIVERED FOR CENTRAL COAST ROAD UPGRADES

Premier Gladys Berejiklian today joined Liberal candidate for the seat of Gosford, Jilly Pilon, to announce a \$23 million roads package for the Central Coast. The projects to be funded as part of the NSW Government package include:
