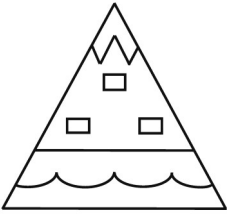

## WHAT IS BUSHCARE?

The Bushcare Program is a partnership between council and volunteers from the community. The purpose of this collaboration is to assist in restoring areas of degraded bushland. The program supports many groups who find reward in contributing to positive change in their local bushland area.

### What is bush regeneration?

Bush regeneration involves the gradual removal of weeds to allow the native plants to regenerate naturally. Unfortunately, removing weeds once is not enough, as they soon reappear in the cleared spaces. So regular follow-up weeding is completed by Bushcare teams.

The changes that result from bush regeneration are best measured over months and years, rather than days and weeks. Success occurs when an ongoing commitment to removing weeds is made to a site over time.

### Where are our sites?

Generally, people like to restore the bushland close to where they live. This makes it easy for them to get to and from the Bushcare site.

However, other bush carers travel to locations some distance from their homes because of friendships they've formed at Bushcare workshops, or because they prefer to volunteer in a particular bushland location.

Whether your preference is for rainforest, wetland, creek line or dune, there is a place to suit you, and you may swap sites or visit different sites whenever you would like to.

### Who can volunteer in the Bushcare Program?

Everyone aged from 16 to 90 years old is welcome to join an existing group or form a new group.

Within each team, there are activities to suit everyone, from physical to moderate impact work - for example, your role may include making the ever-important morning tea!

Everyone can find something to do to help rescue their bushland.

### When do Bushcare volunteers meet?

Most groups meet on a designated day each month, and usually for a period of two to three hours.

Other groups meet more often, such as every fortnight or even every week. The Bushcare Program is very flexible and group members can decide on how often and for how long they meet.

### A Bushcare team can be a great community hub

The Bushcare Program can be a lot more than just pulling

out weeds; the social and health aspects of volunteering should not be overlooked.

When Bushcare volunteers commit to their site, they see it as a chance to get outdoors, to be active and to socialise. Long-standing friendships are often formed and people enjoy the opportunity to discuss issues with some like minded new friends.

Aside from enjoying your meeting days, there are also other opportunities to assist the Bushcare Program, such as promoting your group at community events or festivals, taking photos, writing grant submissions or preparing morning tea.

### How do I become a Bushcare volunteer?

Joining the Bushcare Program is very simple. For residents in the Koolewong, Tascott and Point Clare area Bushcare is located at Goodaywang Reserve, at the northern end of Kurrawa Avenue, Point Clare. At the official launch of the group, the date and details for which are outlined on the front page, a Bushcare Officer will discuss the operation of the program at Goodaywang Reserve.

After formally registering and becoming an active volunteer, your registration and activity within the program entitles you to start participating in all the activities that our Bushcare volunteers enjoy.

Throughout the year, a series of free educational workshops are offered to active volunteers. The workshops provide an enjoyable way for you to learn more about conserving our local bushland.

## WEST GOSFORD INTERSECTION

Our guest speaker at the May meeting was Mr **Chris Dransfield**, the Roads and Maritime Project Manager for the **WEST GOSFORD INTERSECTION UPGRADE**

It was good to look again at the simulation display of the new intersection and to see how traffic will move easily through the junction when all traffic signals are in operation. One questioner was concerned that sufficient time would be allowed for the more elderly to use the pedestrian crossings. The main one of these, at the Central Coast Highway itself will be ten lanes wide and controlled by three sets of lights.

The audience was amazed at the complexity of the infrastructure that had to be relocated or realigned as an ongoing process while the intersection has remained in daily operation.

We are looking forward to early 2016 and the end of gridlock.

### MISSION STATEMENT

The Koolewong and Point Clare-Tascott Progress Association Inc. is a non-profit organisation dedicated to improving quality of life, sense of community and pride in our urban environment.

The coverage area is from the Central Coast Highway, West Gosford, south to the Woy Woy Bridge. This incorporates parts of West Gosford and the suburbs of Point Clare, Tascott, Koolewong and Parks Bay.

### BRISBANE WATER DRIVE

The Association had asked Roads and Maritime Services how the committed \$2 million would be used on the safety improvements on Brisbane Water Drive.

Their response in a letter late last month included the following: 'There will be a **route study** on the Drive from Pont Clare Public School to Manns Road at West Gosford this financial year. The study will include the intersections at Penang St, Lorraine Ave and Jirrah Ave and the focus will be on road safety and efficiency'

It is pleasing to know that the Association's comments would be included for consideration when priorities are determined. Our concern remains however- is it traffic or **pedestrian safety**?

## CENTRAL COAST MARINE DISCOVERY CENTRE

At the Association's meeting in July we were able to welcome once again, Jayne Smith, the CEO of the Community Environment Network which is based on the Ourimbah university campus. Jayne had two special topics that she shared with the members, both of them, as she said, close to her heart.

The first is the **MARINE DISCOVERY CENTRE** beside the lagoon at Terrigal which was officially opened in March 2010. An outline was given as to how the centre came into being and found its home in the no longer used Terrigal Tourist Information Centre,

It is open at weekends and during school holidays when special programmes are arranged and teachers are available. During school terms some excursions are arranged for school groups to learn about issues of sustainability, understanding and enjoyment of our coast's catchments and oceans.

Of recent interest has been the amazing biodiversity that is developing at the *HMAS Adelaide* dive site.

The Discovery Centre is recommended particularly for children and at \$3.00 per child is surely an ideal place for parents and grandchildren to visit with their youngsters.

## COASTAL OPEN SPACE SYSTEM

Jayne's second topic of great interest and concern is the **COASTAL OPEN SPACE SYSTEM**. The COSS has been much in the news of late as it is believed that some development proposals are before local government authorities.

Members were given an outline of the system and learnt that the network of natural reserves was delineated and declared in 1984. It has always been hoped that Council, which has already acquired 65% of the area, would be able to gain control of the remaining 35% and thus prevent these reserves being handed over for other development.

**FRIENDS OF COSS** are eager to see these places protected and that the skyline of Gosford, particularly, remains green and without built structures. The Friends conduct bushwalks and family nature clubs and are involved in bush regeneration and research. Some of their number are animal friendly and all maintain strong community links. Community concern has been expressed recently due to a changing focus in Council's environmental committee structure and the mooted removal of the COSS levy. Those with a love of the great outdoors don't want to see roads and urbanisation encroaching onto our city's much loved green mantle.
